Dear Resident,

It has come to our attention that many people within our community are unaware of the correct telephone number to contact when reporting incidents to Police.

We encourage you to report all matters to the Police, no matter how insignificant you may feel they are. Reporting matters to Police allows us to track trends and allocate our resources accordingly.

As our resources are intelligence driven, it is important you contact the correct telephone numbers.

000 - EMERGENCY

In the case of an emergency or when reporting a crime in progress (the offender is still there)

131 444 – PAL (Police Assistance Line)

To report non urgent incidents and minor crimes that do not require follow up, such as malicious damage or Break and Enters where the offender is not known.

1800 333 000 - CRIME STOPPERS

With information about a crime, criminal activity or traffic matter. These calls are anonymous.

It is hoped the community will report *all* incidents of malicious damage, drugs, traffic, break and enter and anti social behaviour matters to the police. By promptly reporting matters to police it helps us task our resources accordingly.

Police must prioritise their jobs and sometimes there may be delays.

POLICE CONCERN

At a recent meeting with the Crime Prevention Unit at Gosford Police Station, members of the Progress Association discussed the amount of information being provided by Kariong residents to local Police.

Their view was that they receive a smaller number of calls regarding incidents from Kariong than from many other Gosford suburbs. For example, as the result of regular calls from the Peninsula area they have placed a greater number of resources into that area, having been able to build up an intelligence sketch of who, and where, the problems are.

They do this across the Gosford Police Area Command, but stress that Kariong figures low on their radar, as there are fewer calls from here. Looking at stats for the past 12 months does show that the rate of incidents in Kariong has certainly decreased. But Police, and the Progress Association, are concerned that there may be things happening in Kariong that residents are just putting up with because they are not sure how to report. Or more importantly fell that maybe nothing happens anyway when they do report!

The Police stress that all reports are recorded, and over a period they can build up a profile of events, or concerns, that they can act on. Which is how the Peninsula is currently getting their attention.

So please read the Police page in this edition, and let the Police know of anything that concerns you.

Or just ring them and have a chat as to what you, or they, can do about something that concerns you.

Don't forget that there is a book at the Neighbourhood Centre that you can also express your concerns.

And you can use that book to let us know of the results of your Police contact.

<u>Mt Penang Highway Precinct and the Langford Drive / Woy</u> <u>Woy Road intersection</u>: no action on these two matters over the holidays, but we will revisit these in the next Connection.

G'Day folks,

I'm back with some more news from Kariong Rural Fire Brigade.

First of all, we hope you had a safe and enjoyable festive season and all ready for an exciting new year.

OK, let's talk about some fire related business. First and foremost were the fires across the country in Victoria and Western Australia which were prime examples of what I mentioned previously and that is how unpredictable the weather can be. Blazing heat there and monsoon-like conditions here. Still, the underlying fact is that we all need to be on our toes till the end of March because that's when the "official" fire danger period ends. It only takes about two weeks of dry breezy weather to turn things around and throw in a bit of heat and there you have it; Bushfire problems.

During December, a crew from Kariong in company with a strike team from Gosford, went to Colo Heights in the Hawkesbury district to assist with firefighting operations there. This fire was causing some headaches and needed a fair bit of work done on it so the crews attending had their job cut out for them. Another job Kariong attended was the structure fire at Somersby. Kariong along with other RFS brigades and Fire Rescue NSW attended the job in the pouring rain and it took about five hours to extinguish. Sadly, some irreplaceable property was lost but thankfully no one was injured.

Now, I want to talk to you about joining the NSWRFS. It's not just for the blokes you know and yes Kariong ladies, I'm talking to you. If you're looking for a worthwhile and challenging volunteer job to do why not come up and see us? Being part of a community organisation looking after your own community is a very personally satisfying thing. There are heaps of skills you can be trained in besides firefighting so if you've ever thought about it, stop thinking about it and take the first step. If you feel that you've got some time up your sleeve and you're up for the challenge then pop up and see us. Do you know someone who is affected by problem gambling?

People who gamble heavily are often stigmatised and feel great shame so unfortunately they don't seek help until they reach a crisis. In a recent study, participants referred to problem gamblers as "lower class, uneducated, lowincome, lazy individuals who lacked self-control, and were greedy and selfish." But in fact most problem gamblers are young males who are highly educated, well paid, and very hard workers.

Typically, people who gamble to problematic levels feel ashamed and guilty because of the debts they have accumulated, because of the lies they told to partners, friends and family and because they keep going back to gamble. And they worse they feel about themselves the more they will gamble.

Harm can be far-reaching, causing significant damage to individuals, families and communities. Some of the effects of problem gambling include financial loss or bankruptcy, relationship breakdowns, or health problems such as depression, anxiety, ulcers, high blood pressure, or even suicidal thoughts.

We all need to look out for colleagues and family members and friends who may be impacted by problem gambling-it can happen to anyone.

If you think someone may be struggling with gambling, either directly or as the result of their relationship with a problem gambler, take them aside for a cuppa and let them know that help is available

By looking out for people and addressing problems before they reach crisis point, you can make a real difference in their life and help reduce the shame and stigma of problem gambling.

UCMH Counselling Services provides free Gambling Help counselling for anyone affected by problem gambling. We are at Kariong Neighbourhood Centre on Wednesday evenings from 4.00pm-8.00pm and Saturday mornings from 9.00am-1.00pm.
