
Kariong Library Action Group

'Emergency +' is a national app developed by Australia's emergency services and their Government and industry partners, helping people to call the right number at the right time, anywhere in Australia.



'Emergency+' also includes SES and Police Assistance Line numbers as options, so non-emergency calls are made to the most appropriate number.

Kariong Progress Association



On Tuesday 16 June a delegation of

three members from the Progress Association met with the new State Local Member for Gosford, Kathy Smith. Kathy had been to a Progress meeting prior to the recent election, where she heard from Progress members about local issues. This recent meeting at her office in Woy Woy was to update her on those issues.

Langford Drive / Woy Woy Road intersection: Kathy Smith advised the delegation that she had clarified that Woy Woy Road and Langford Drive were both the responsibility of Gosford Council. This means that the State Government would not allocate any funding towards the intersection upgrading costs. However, it has been established that the previous Federal Government allocation of \$675,000 is still available, and the Council will provide the balance (of the \$1.5m total costing.) This still leaves us with the lesser acceptable solution approved by Council of pedestrian controlled traffic lights, away from the intersection, and new right turn lanes into and out of Langford Drive. We will continue to discuss the matter with the Council.

<u>Mt Penang</u>: No further developments at this stage, but any relevant information will be reported in our future reports.

<u>Kariong School Underpass:</u> recent contact with the RMS, at Newcastle, has secured an agreement that they will now be undertaking regular reviews of the graffiti, noting the tags, and hopefully following up with Police action against the offenders.

<u>Parking of cars for sale</u>: a reminder that it is illegal to park cars, and advertise them for sale, on the grass verge opposite the Progress Hall. Just be warned that Rangers are targeting this group.

<u>CCTV cameras for Kariong</u>: the Progress Association attended a recent on-site meeting with Council officers to discuss the project and specific camera locations. The proposed locations for the cameras are the Skate Park, and the shopping centres at Mitchell Drive and at Arunta Avenue. The equipment has been ordered, and latest estimates are installation should be late June/early August.

<u>Progress Hall</u>: You can book the Hall for parties, functions and ongoing activities.

No Interest Loan Scheme

Have you lived in the local Gosford Area for at least 3 months? Are you on a low income? If so you maybe eligible for a No Interest Loan.

The amount you can borrow will vary, depending on your income & your capacity to make repayments. The maximum is \$800 for entertainment items such as TVs/Stereos, & up to \$1,200 for essential items like white goods/furniture. NILS* may also be provided to meet other essential needs like health aids, car registration or education costs. NILS* is not for emergency relief, bond or rent money, living expenses or debt repayment. The limit for people on Newstart/Youth Allowance is between \$600 - \$800, to ensure we don't place anyone in financial hardship. The repayment period is usually around 12 to 18 months. There are no fees, charges or interest. **Call 4329 4477** for further information/application pack. NILS* interviews can be held at the Kariong Neighbourhood Centre - by appointment only.

Achievement for Personal Best

For all students, however, what is important is not to be measured against set targets, but against benchmarks that reflect individual growth. Professor Geoff Masters (ACER Chief Executive) speaks of more effective assessments that involve 'stretch challenges - tasks that are neither too easy nor unrealistically difficult'.

He uses the analogy, that elite high jumpers don't begin with the high jump bar set to the Olympic standard, but instead, begin at smaller heights and challenge themselves to go higher on each occasion.

Having an individual benchmark is not about lowering the bar, but recognising that the road to high achievement starts with smaller steps that build on existing knowledge and skills to develop new ones at a higher standard. At Kariong Mountains High School, our focus on knowing students and how they learn sees us aim to apply this principle to all out students in all our classes.

Much loved Kariong local identity receives Rotary Community Service Award

Helen was recently recognized for her extensive community work by Rotary Club of Kariong/ Somersby.

Helen came to Australia from Edinburgh in 1959. She and her husband travelled extensively with his work in the Special Branch of Scotland Yard, which gave her inspiration and material for the books that she would later write.

Helen ran a children's home in Strathfield in Sydney before coming to Kariong in 1989. She is a very well know and loved local identity both for her valued community work, and also for her writing.

Helen has written two books - Vaila's Capri, which was published in 2010, and Short Stories, published in 2014. A copy of Short Stories is available at the Centre if you would like to borrow it from our library at any time.
