As the weather warms up please be advised we are now a registered sunsafe service and require all children in our care to wear hats in line with regulations. We can't wait for the spring weather to begin!

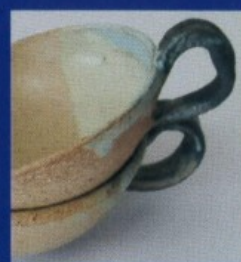

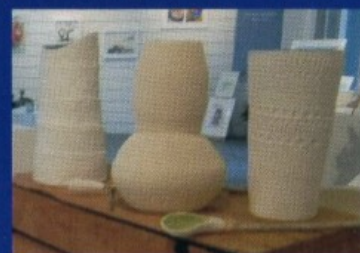
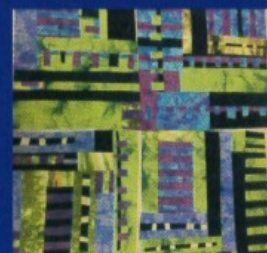

For the information of Year 12 students:

The UAC Educational Access Scheme (EAS) is open until 30th November. To apply for EAS you need to demonstrate that your Year 11 and/or Year 12 studies have been negatively affected for at least six months, as a result of circumstances beyond your control or choosing. If you are eligible, and your ATAR is below the required cut-off for a course, an institution can increase your selection rank (known as an 'equity adjustment') or reserve you a place in the course.

All KMHS Year 12 students have been emailed this information, in the event that they are eligible. Our careers advisor can be contacted to assist with information, if needed and information can be obtained from the UAC website.

We hope that all Year 12 students had a calm and confident HSC experience and that they are enjoying this 'gap period' before embarking on their next life experience.

POKER MACHINES: There's no strategy to beat them and no way to cheat them. They are totally random.

The winning or losing combination has nothing to do with what is on the screen, or what happened on the last press of the button. It is determined by a random number generator. Every spin is random.

This very randomness affects your brain by affecting your dopamine system. Dopamine is a neurotransmitter that affects the pleasure centres of the brain, influencing how we see the world and survive. Whenever we experience something pleasurable, such as eating a meal or winning some money, our dopamine neurons get excited. This helps the brain to learn about pleasure and rewards, and as pleasurable things often help us to survive, the brain attempts to predict when it will happen again.

While you play the pokies your brain is trying to predict the patterns, trying to anticipate future rewards. But here's the catch, poker machines are completely random. There are no patterns. So the more you play the more your brain is flooded with dopamine. Your brain is constantly stimulated, just like someone using cocaine.

The best way to beat the pokies is to be realistic. Every now and then you might come out ahead, but don't trust in luck. You have to expect to lose money, so only gamble what you can afford. Set a limit and stick to it. Don't try to win back what you've lost. Chasing losses leads to desperation and playing more, and playing more can create changes in your brain which can lead to addiction.

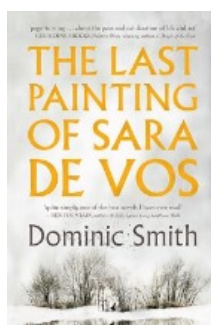

Complaints to the Energy & Water Ombudsman NSW increase in the Central Coast area

According to the Energy & Water Ombudsman NSW's (EWON) recently released Annual Report, complaints increased from the Sydney Surrounds region of NSW (which includes the Central Coast) in 2017/2018, rising 14% from 2016/2017 to 1,944. This is above the overall increase for the state of 12%.

There were 41 complaints per 10,000 people – the sixth highest number of complaints from any region in NSW.

Billing complaints in the Sydney Surrounds region rose 16% in 2017/2018 and continue to be the most significant complaint issue raised with EWON, present in 60% of all complaints. Billing issues include high and estimated bills, billing errors and problems with opening and closing accounts.

The report also shows a 14% increase in complaints related to customer service, including poor service, failure to respond, incorrect advice or information, and failure to consult or inform customers. These issues are present in 48% of complaints from the Sydney Surrounds.

Complaints related to energy affordability, including payment difficulties, debt collection, credit default listing and disconnections, increased by 47% in Sydney Surrounds, and were present in 24% of all complaints during the period.

Electricity accounted for 88% of EWON's complaints in Sydney Surrounds in 2017/2018 and rose by 26% in 2017/2018. Gas complaints accounted for 9% of complaints, but fell by 32%, and water complaints also fell by 32% and make up three percent of all complaints.
